# Author Talk: Shirleylee Shields

Join local author Shirleylee Shields on Wednesday, May 17 at 6:30 PM for a discussion of her memoir, A World Within A World.

Born Metis, Shirleylee was part of the 60s Scoop and was placed in foster care at the age of three. Raised in the Holdeman Mennonite group, she was forced into an arranged marriage and immediate motherhood.

Shirleylee fought for her freedom and custody of her four young children for many years, and she is the first woman in Canada and the United States to have taken this religious group to court.

Shirleylee's memoir chronicles her journey of self-discovery.


