Psst! Did you know we have a large variety of puzzles available for you to take out? We have something suitable for everyone in your family. Stop in to see what we have!



The Most Overdue Book

Colonel Robert Walpole apparently borrowed the book in 1667-8 when he was an undergrad at Trinity College though the book was not returned according to biographer, Dr J. H. Plumb. There are no surviving records of loans from that time so the exact date it was borrowed is uncertain. Dr Plumb discovered the book while working on the biography at Houghton Hall in Norfolk. He returned it to Sidney Sussex on January 16, 1956, at the suggestion of Walpole's descendant. It was therefore at least 287 years overdue.

"Scriptores rerum Germanicarum septentrionalium vicinorumque populorum diversi" was the title of the book.


